**2022 Asia Classic Car Challenge (“ACCC”)**

Dear All,

We hope you and your families are safe and well.

The last two years have been a difficult time for everyone, and, as you know, the ACCC was put on hold over this time. As the regional situation slowly improves, we wanted to update you on the 2022 plans for the ACCC.

Travel in Asia is still a serious challenge for many, and operational logistics are still very difficult for race organisers. Freight issues are extreme, and many people have faced financial challenges over the past two years, making plans difficult to lock in.

However, we wanted to advise that the ACCC Race Committee are currently in discussions with Sepang International Circuit, and others, in relation to restarting the ACCC series in 2022.

This of course depends on many factors, the most important of all being you, the drivers, teams, crews and participants.

As before, we plan to operate on Malaysia Championship Series (“MCS”) weekends, however, before committing to the 2022 season, we need to understand how many competitors are in a position to participate in the ACCC in 2022. The 2022 MCS and draft ACCC schedule is below.

A critical step in confirming our 2022 plans is to confirm how many entries are keen to race in 2022.

Given changes to the incoming travel restrictions to Malaysia have been announced to take effect from 1 April, we could not, however, guarantee that we could be operational by May.

Therefore, we are planning to start in July, depending on entry numbers, and other factors.

The **Provisional 2022 Race Calendar** is as follows:

The above depends on confirmation with Sepang Circuit, and, most importantly, ensuring that we have enough entries confirmed to hold a successful event on each date.

**Therefore, we need to ask - Which teams and drivers are in a position to race in 2022, based on the draft calendar above?**

Could you please contact us to advise if you are planning to race in ACCC in 2022, and how many events you would consider possible. I am sure you can appreciate that we need clarity on numbers of entries before making commitment to the circuit for time slots and events.

**Your replies by 1<sup>st</sup> May would be greatly appreciated, so we can plan accordingly.**

For your reference, please see attached the revised 2022 Racing Regulations. We have made changes to allow more cars into the series, including 1990's race cars, as well as other amendments to existing classes. We have added greater flexibility to provide more opportunities for increased grid sizes.

We are also pleased to announce that the ACCC has changed ownership. Whilst this is a significant change in the history of the series, the management, and people involved, have not changed, and we look forward to restarting the ACCC with your support.
